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

Has Jesus Christ forgiven your sins? Then you are a happy man or woman, because this is the most wonderful thing that can happen to anybody. But what about the people who do not know Jesus yet? How are they going to find out about Him? Jesus said that it is our job to tell them.

But perhaps you do not know how to win souls. Perhaps you are afraid. Or you don't know what to say.

We talked to three people who work at the Matopo Bookroom. In their work they spend time visiting people and winning them to Christ. We asked them questions about their work. Perhaps their answers will help you.

Question: Why do you enjoy telling people about Jesus Christ?

Mr. Sibanda: Because He forgave my sins and I want my friends to know Him.

Mrs. Brechbill: Because I want people to be happy in this life and in the life to come.

Mr. Bhebhe: Because I have a burden that this salvation which I have should be passed on to someone

Question: Are you sometimes afraid to speak? How do you overcome this?

Mr. Sibanda: Yes, sometimes I am afraid. People can become angry with me when I speak of Jesus Christ. They say, "He is not from our tribe. He is a European." Sometimes they ask me, "Can you really see God or Jesus?" I say, "Yes, by believing I can see Him in this room." I overcome my fear when I remember that Jesus is in me all the time.

Mrs. Brechbill: No, I am not afraid now, but I was at first. I overcame

it by praying about it. I found that the more I spoke to people the less afraid I was.

Mr. Bhebhe: It takes courage to talk to some people. You have to listen to how they talk and then answer them wisely and turn them to the Word of God.

Question: What do you think is the best way to begin?

Mr. Sibanda: First I pray and ask for power. Then God leads me to the houses of people who need Him. I tell them I am a Christian and I come with good news.

Mrs. Brechbill: There are many different ways. I like to get people to talk about themselves. Sometimes they will tell me that they are not happy, or they will tell of some need. Then I can show them that the One they need is Jesus Christ

Mr. Bhebhe: I say, "Do you know Jesus?" They say, "Yes." Then I say, "Have you received Him as

your own Saviour?" If they say "no", then I tell them that they do not really know Him unless they have received Him. I tell them how to receive Him.

Question: Do you find that people like tracts? What do you do if they refuse them?

Mr. Sibanda: Some people are hungry for tracts but some refuse them. If they do, I explain what is in the papers and they usually take them.

Mrs, Brechbill: Yes, people like tracts. I have not

found anyone who refused.

Mr. Bhebhe: Some people say, "We understand better when you tell us and then we read the papers which you give us." But some refuse. I say, "Some day you will call for them and the time will be closed.

Ouestion: What Scripture verses do you use when you speak to people about Christ?

Mr. Sibanda: I use Isaiah 53: 1-5 and I John 1: 9. Mrs. Brechbill: Romans 3: 23 helps people see their need of a Saviour. John 3: 16 shows them who the Saviour is.

Mr. Bhebhe: With rich people in town I use Mark 10: 17-22

Question: Have you been able to lead someone to Christ? How did it happen?

Mr. Sibanda: One day I went to visit a man here in town who was a great sinner. He said, "God cannot forgive me because I have done too many sins. I have been fighting and stealing and lying.

I said, "That is the devil in you doing these things. If you want to be a son of God, repent and confess your sins."

He prayed with me and received Christ. Now he comes to church and I still give him tracts to encourage him.

Mrs. Brechbill: There was a teacher with whom I worked at one of the missions. She had left the mission and had gone into sin. I had not seen her for more than twenty years.

One day her sister came and told me that she was in hospital. I visited her and gave her tracts and prayed with her. Later I wrote her a letter and I asked many of my friends to pray for her.

Two or three weeks later I received a letter. She thanked me for my visit and said, "My heart is changed." I believe she repented on that day.

Mr. Bhebhe: I had a friend near my home who was not a Christian. I began to stop at his village on my way to church and ask him to go with me. He agreed to go, and as we walked we talked about the way of salvation.

He said, "The way is too hard." I answered, "With you it is hard, but with Jesus

One day at church he said, "Now I feel that all you have said is from the Scripture and it is true." That day he accepted Jesus into his heart.

I Have Lost My Bible

It was one day after school. A little girl of seven years came crying to her teacher.

"Teacher, I have lost my Bible," she said. "Can you help me find it?"

The Bible was easy to find. It was under some other books on one of the desks. With a bright smile the child picked up her Bible and held it tightly against her heart. Her Bible was not lost after all.

But what if she had really lost it? And what if you lost yours and I lost mine? Suppose we could not find them again and could not get new ones. What if there were no Bibles in our land and a real famine for the Word of God came to us. That would be a terrible thing, wouldn't it?

At certain times in the past it has been very hard for people to find a Bible. A thousand years ago only the rich people had enough money to buy Bibles. Even today Bibles are few in some countries. Not long ago I heard of a country where three men had to read the same Bible. One man learned to read it upside-down and another learned to read it from the side. At another place there was only one Bible. It was chained to a pole in the church, and people waited in a queue to have a chance to read it.

It is hard to think of our world without the Word of God. The Bible tells us about past things which have happened and about things which are going to happen later on. It tells us who God is and why He loves us. It shows us how to be saved from sin and how to live to please our Saviour.

Is you Bible lost? If you are not reading it, it is lost. If you are not obeying it, it is lost. If you do not love it, it is lost.

The Bible can be your best friend. Read it, learn it, love it, and follow it always.

given if they are sorry.


It is our work to ask them to repent. We must tell them how, and help them to do it. Then we must show them that a Christian is different from people who are not Christians.

When we confess, He says, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved." Acts 16: 30, 31. Believing on Christ is not just receiving with the mind, but receiving with the spirit.
