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
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

OVERSEAS TOUR

On Monday, 26th June, Bishop and Mrs. P. M. Kumalo and Rev. and Mrs. S. M. Mudenda left Bulawayo by plane. They were on their way to the 102nd General Conference of the Brethren in Christ Church in America, which met from 28th June until 2nd July. They went first to Salisbury, then to London, where they met Sithabile Kumalo (Bishop Kumalo's daughter) and Lot Senda. They then flew to New York City and Dayton, Ohio. The General Conference met at the Memorial Holiness Camp Ground nearby. After the Conference Bishop Kumalo, Rev. Mudenda and Rev. Hem Paul, from India, accompanied by Rev. and Mrs. G. C. Frey, contacted churches in four states and part of Canada. On 17th July the brethren flew from New York to Brazil in South America, where they were delegates at the Mennonite World Con-Bishop Kumalo and Rev. Mudenda ference. arrived back in Bulawayo on 25th July.

The Women's Missionary Prayer Circle in America collected money so that an African woman could be sent to visit the churches in America. Mrs. Kumalo and Mrs. Mudenda were chosen to represent the women in Africa, so at the close of the General Conference Mrs. Kumalo flew to California with H. H. Brubaker then visited in the Western, Mid-Western and Central Conference areas of the Brethren in Christ Church. Mrs. Mudenda went north to Canada. The ladies spent the last two weeks in the Atlantic and Allegheny Conference areas. On 10th August they flew out of New York to London, where they spent Friday with Rhodesian and Zambian friends. UMNIKELO



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Maria Tshuma conducted a survey in the townships of Salisbury to find those with Brethren in Christ connections. She found 554 in Mufakose, 413 in Highfield and 66 in Harare. The Church is now awaiting a decision on its application for a church site in Salisbury.

After a brief illness Mrs. Aaron Bhebhe passed away in March. She was buried in Bulawayo. Twenty-four cars and three city buses carried people from the Mpopoma Church to the place of burial. In the midst of sorrow a note of victory was evident throughout the service.

In February a message was received that the mother of Clarence Musser (and the former Bishop J. Earl Musser) had passed away. A second message in March told of the passing of the father. Brother Musser, who served as secretary of the Mission Board for more than twenty-five years, visited Africa in 1956. He was present for the Golden Jubilee celebration at Macha and also laid the cornerstone of the church at Wanezi.

James Leta, third from the right in the picture above, passed away at his village on 14th February. Brother Leta had been very ill and had spent two months in the Mpilo Hospital.

Joe Nkala, builder/contractor, was killed on 23rd March in a car accident near Lalapansi, where he had been working.

Mahutsha Mafu, who was baptised by Rev. Levi Doner in 1905 and opened the Gwabila Outstation as a pastor-teacher, passed away on 16th May. He was buried in the cemetery at Matopo Mission.

After two heart attacks, the Rev. G. R. Griffiths died at the Bulawayo Central Hospital on 23rd May. Mr. Griffiths, who was 64, had served as a missionary under the London Missionary Society in Botswana and Rhodesia for nearly 30 years. The funeral was held at Hope Fountain Mission on 26th May.

Brother and Sister William Silungwe were ordained to the ministry at Sikalongo Mission on Sunday, 27th February, 1972.

Mrs. Mangisi Sibanda was a speaker at a meeting of the Women's Organisation at the Bethseda Mission of the Methodist Church near Victoria Falls.

Zambia Regional Conference met at Macha Mission from 19th to 23rd April. The theme was OUR CHURCH AND GOD'S WORD.

Daryl Climenhaga, son of David, arrived in Bulawayo in February and is now teaching at Matopo Mission.

The Lusaka City Council has granted a church site at the New Kanyama Township to the Brethren in Christ Church.

Rev. and Mrs. Chester Wingert, who spent several years in Africa at Wanezi and Mtshabezi Missions, returned in April. Chester is the assistant manager of the Matopo Book Centre. Mrs. Wingert was born in Africa; she is the daughter of Myrom Taylor, who died as a result of being attacked by a lion while working at Sikalongo Mission.
