

Meet Murray's New Director, Janet Vogel

On June 1, 2024, Murray Library will welcome its new director: Messiah University alum Janet Vogel. Janet comes to Messiah with extensive library leadership experience: as the Youth Services Manager at Frederick County (MD) Public Libraries from 2014-2020, and more recently as director of the Hiram College Library in Hiram, Ohio. But Janet's interest in libraries and librarianship goes further back than that, in fact, all the way back to her days as a Messiah College undergraduate in the early 2000s.

In fall 1999, Janet arrived from Springfield, Vermont, as a first-year student, deeply interested in history and in learning more generally (she graduated from Messiah with a B.A. in history, and with minors in both German and Computer Science). Janet's First Year Seminar instructor that fall was Jonathan Lauer, the director of Murray Library at the time and a superb classroom teacher. Not only did Janet learn from Jonathan about the writer Wallace Stegner, but she also learned that being a library director was an extraordinarily interesting job.

Jonathan encouraged Janet to work in Murray Library as a student, and to consider librarianship as a career—and she did. As a Messiah student, Janet worked at the Murray Library circulation desk. Later, while finishing up her Master's in Library Science from the University of Illinois, Janet served as Murray Library's Evening Circulation Supervisor.

Janet left that role in Murray Library in 2008, when she began working in the Frederick County Public Libraries system. Even then, however, she stayed connected to Messiah College, serving as an adjunct instructor in the History Department from 2011-2015 (John Fea says that she was "outstanding" in that role). Janet would be quick to tell you that Messiah has played an outsized role in helping her develop as a scholar, as a Christian, and as a servant to others—a mission she hopes to contribute to in the years ahead.

Please join the Murray Library staff in welcoming Janet (back) to Messiah University when she arrives on campus in June.

Come hear these personal narratives and reserve the "books" of your choice online.



Sow and Grow Recap


Although the weather was chilly outside, we had fun ringing in the first day of spring by planting seeds!
